



## 2. Play Structure.

A meeting at the play structure with Donna Williams and the people responsible for the parking lot revealed that the swing may have to be relocated, but was suggested it remain a part of the play structure.

## 3. Canada Day.

Glen Trebble reported that sponsorship, as well as garbage disposal are taken care of. However some aspects of the Canada Day festivities still need to be resolved:

Fireworks- has been difficult to arrange.

Entertainment - Judy Wagdin has offered to help in this area. Choir can open the festivities, trying to rent an inflatable castle.

Insurance - Questions as to what parties are responsible in terms of coverage. Having a licensed event changes the insurance and liability. Bernie McMullen suggested that a dance not be part of Canada Day. More info is needed from Gabe Miller.

## 4. Jock River Fountain.

Bernie McMullen reported that a person from the Rideau Valley Conservation Auth. Said it would be possible to put a fountain in the river, but suggested that it not be done now. Gabe Miller needs to provide information concerning grants available for such a project.

## 5. Welcome Wagon.

The Welcome Wagon is to be dropped from the agenda, but may be coupled in the future with Neighborhood Watch.

## 6. Business Park.

A note from Councillor Stavinga's office was read indicating that the City is willing to work with the RVA on this matter.

## 7. Munster Sewage.

Harvey Snyder reported that the process is on schedule and that the second report will be presented to the Environmental Services Committee on May 27<sup>th</sup>.

## 8. Fox Signs.

Bernie McMullen reported that he has talked with the person who will be supplying the fox signs who has said he will not make one sign. Funding is still in question for this project.

## 9. Ward Boundaries.

No new information.

## 10. Neighbourhood Watch.

In order for this project to operate in a community Block Captains are required. Don Flanders reported that the first public meeting about Neighbourhood Watch is in June.

## 11. Tulips.

Judy Wagdin suggested that tulips not be sold as a fundraiser as there is too much work involved for relatively meager returns.

## **New Business:**

### **1. City Grants**

No indication from City as to whether a grant will come through. Last year it was received in August.

### **2. Richmond Walking Paths.**

It was suggested that a letter be written to Donna Williams requesting an outline of where existing walking paths are and what areas are available for new paths. A request that the city improve the existing paths should also be made. It should also request information as to who made the existing paths. Glen Trebble will help, and it was also suggested that the RVA go to the friends of the Jock River for more information.

### **3. Financial Report.**

It was pointed out that the RVA's Economic Development Fund helps with the Richmond website as well as increasing business exposure in Richmond. The Legion may provide financial help to the RVA.

### **4. Bus Routes.**

In September Richmond will lose a bus route to Fallowfield Station, however a fourth route was added due to a time change.
