**Minutes of February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2005**

**Business arising from minutes of February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2005**

**1. Richmond Water-source threat:**

Possible leak or break on an existing pipeline on February 27<sup>th</sup> at upstream side of the twin crossing (south shore) (behind Richmond Nursery). Municipal Government states that this is not a break after they completed their testing. An independent examination of this stated that significant amounts of ecoli is present. If this is a leak, it is possible to have been leaking for 2-3 weeks prior to discovery. The ecoli was returned with a reading of 10 by Acutest.

The city has not disclosed what the reading of the Municipal Government test was.

Letter sent to Dennis O'Connor requesting help and advice.

The next water testing drop-off is on Wednesday night – March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2005.

Appeal to the ombudsman is still in motion – nothing new to report.



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**Motion 2005.05** moved by Ted Brown seconded by Jane Campbell **that \$100.00 from the pipeline fund be allocated to future testing of this and other potential breaks. Passed.**
